On 12 November 1921 was 'Black Tuesday', when Waihi miner Fred Evans was killed while on strike with 1,500 of his workmates. The Waihi Miners' Strike was a pivotal point in Aotearoa New Zealand's industrial relations history and every year we remember Fred and the significant impact of the strike.

110 years later, we have wins to celebrate. The introduction of Fair Pay Agreements will hopefully mean a return to some real worker power that has been lost in the decades since the Employment Contracts Act gutted unionism.
